### **Abbreviated CV**

Shuaib Ismail Manjra is a Sports and Occupational Medicine Physician and Consultant. He has been a member of the UCT Council and its Executive Committee since 2016 in addition to a range of university committees. He also serves as a Senior Honorary Lecturer in the School of Public Health.

His experience ranges from consulting to Fortune 500 companies to trade unions, NGOs, government, public entities, state-owned enterprises, national and international sports federations, and to numerous landmark human rights cases. After completing his medical degree in 1987 from the University of Natal, he worked in paediatrics and in general practice before taking up a position in 1990 at the Industrial Health Research Group, based in the Department of Sociology at UCT. He concurrently studied for a post-graduate diploma in occupational health and a post-graduate degree in sports medicine at UCT and graduated with distinctions in both in 1991-2. He was awarded the Helen Suzman Leadership Award (now the Chevening Fellowship) through the British Council through which he completed his master's degree in occupational medicine in 1993 at the University of Birmingham in the United Kingdom, where he graduated with distinction. He is an Associate Fellow of the College of Public Health Medicine.

Shuaib serves on the boards of Ndifuna Ukwazi and the Trauma Centre for Survivors of Violence and Torture – both working in the field of human and constitutional rights. He has held statutory appoints as chairperson of the board of the South African Institute for Drug-Free Sport, member of the Ministerial Task Team established to evaluate and recommend a high-performance strategy for South African sport, and as member of the Provincial Medical Advisory Panel to the Workers Compensation Commissioner. He has served or presently serves as chief medical officer of Cricket South Africa (CSA), chairperson of the medical commission of the South African Sports Confederation and Olympic Committee (SASCOC), chief medical officer of Team South Africa to Olympic, Paralympic and Commonwealth Games, chairperson of the medical committee of the International Netball Federation (INF) and member of the Medical Panel of the International Hockey Federation (FIH).
